POINTS OF PROGRESS AND GROWTH EXPECTATION

As we look back over the last two years, we see a lot of growth in the state of Louisiana in areas that matter:

- Outmigration from the state is slowing (for the first time in years).
- Employment is up although the labor force participation rate (the percentage of working age people actively working or looking for work) is below the national average.
- Median income is up but still ranked 48th in the nation.

Another plus for the state is that while the 2024 Tax Foundation ranking was 40, because the state adopted a significant pro-growth tax reform package in the special session just after those rankings were released, the Foundation noted the state's overall ranking would have improved to 26th with those changes. Additionally, the Foundation analysis said the state would have ranked among the top 15 in four of the five major categories of taxation (individual income taxes, corporate income taxes, property taxes, and unemployment insurance taxes).

LSU Health Shreveport has been awarded a five-year, \$7.5 million grant from the National Science Foundation (NSF) to establish a new Center for Post-Transcriptional Regulation. Led by Oren Rom, PhD, RD, Senior Associate Dean for Basic and Translational Research and Wayne Orr, PhD, Vice Chair for Pathology and Director of the Center for Cardiovascular Diseases and Sciences, this award represents the first, and largest, NSF-funded center grant in the history of LSUHS.



LSU Health Shreveport's recruitment of 14 new research faculty from top-tier institutions across the U.S. brought over \$20 million in new NIH funding to North Louisiana and significantly expanded the institution's research capacity.

ENABLING PREPAREDNESS, RESEARCH AND TRAINING FOR EMERGING VIRAL THREATS

LSU Health Shreveport's new BSL-3+ facility enables rapid response research, workforce training and diagnostic readiness for high-risk viruses. The facility is one of only 20 BSL-3+ laboratories in North America. It is the first of its scale in North Louisiana and strategically positioned to support national biodefense and public health efforts.





REMAINS TOP U.S. PRODUCER

Natural gas production in the Haynesville Shale dipped in 2024 due to historically low natural gas prices, which came after the Haynesville production reached a record high in March 2023. Due to the depths of the drilling in the Haynesville Formation, the cost of drilling is more expensive than other hot beds in the country like the Marcellus in the Appalachia region. The Haynesville Shale is still in the top 3 of producing regions in the U.S.












SEVERANCE TAX CAP VS NATURAL GAS EARNINGS

During the March 2025 election, state voters went to the polls to consider many provisions within proposed Amendment 2, which included removing the cap that limits how much severance tax revenue local governments can receive from the state for oil, gas and other mineral activity on their lands. The amendment also accounted for profits from brine, which would be the extraction method used for lithium.



Currently parishes are capped at the amount

of severance tax they receive at around \$1.25 million*, and the rest is directed to the state budget.

The amendment failed at the ballot box so legislators are working on separate bills to remove or change the cap on the amount of severance tax revenues parishes receive versus send to the state government.

UTILITY FRIENDLY REFORM

Growing communities, new manufacturing, and new data centers require increased demand for electricity. Keeping existing plants in operation and building new, advanced nuclear power is critical to meeting this increasing consumer demand for electricity with reliable, baseload power.

Permitting reform is essential for the utility sector due to significant demand growth and the expansion of new energy projects during the next decade. Statutory changes covering NEPA, CWA, the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and other statutes will provide greater certainty and streamlined permitting processes.

NEW STATE DEPARTMENT

The Louisiana Department of Energy and Natural Resources (DENR), the state's agency for managing natural recources, is now the Department of Conservation and Energy (C&E), with segmented offices such as Permitting and Compliance, and the Office of Energy, which supports development of a reliable and resilient energy ecosystem.



COUNTS AND DENSITY OF HOME LOCATIONS FOR PRIVATE PRIMARY JOBS

The Shreveport-Bossier MSA has its largest concentration of jobs within the city centers, though there are many employers outside of that immediate area. This map (the density map) shows the concentration of jobs in density and job count. While the circular graphic shows the

amount of people who drive from their homes into the MSA to work, including the number of people and what direction their homes are relative to their jobs. While more than half of the workers in our area live within 10 miles of their offices (65,318), a significant portion live 10-24 miles away (27,530) and greater than 50 miles (23,842). This graphic just illustrates one more way that our road, bridge and interstate systems are useful but also heavily trafficked in the Shreveport-Bossier MSA, in addition to truck traffic using the roadways for commerce.



The \$128 million I-20 major rehabilitation project consists of total reconstruction of all the travel lanes and on/off ramps at five interchanges from Benton Road to Industrial Drive in Bossier City. This project is one of the largest investments in the north Louisiana interstate system in many years, providing a complete overhaul of the roadway for the first time since this section of I-20 was constructed in the 1960s.

JIMMIE DAVIS BRIDGE

Estimated completion mid to late 2027

Construction on the \$361 million Jimmie Davis Bridge Replacement (LA 511) project over the Red River is in full swing! Work is underway on the new 4-lane bridge and the widening and realignment of the LA 511 roadway approaches to the bridge on both sides of the river. As of October 2025, progress continues on driving pile to form the foundations of the new structure, hauling significant amounts of dirt to form the new on & off ramps to the bridge and installing new drainage systems on LA 511 as the roadway takes shape to align with a widened, modernized structure.





Barksdale is an award-winning base that is home to warrior Airmen of the 2nd Bomb Wing, Air Force Global Strike Command, 8th Air Force, 307th Bomb Wing, and a host of mission partners. The Louisiana Governor's Office reported that in Louisiana military-related activity provides more than 77,000 jobs and pays almost \$280 million in state and local taxes.


Other than the state government, the first, fourth, and fifth largest employers respectively are Fort Johnson, Barksdale Air Force Base and the Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base-New Orleans.

WELCOME **HOME**

With as many as 2-3,000 spouses stationed at Barksdale with active-duty service members, a key piece of legislation to help them in employment is Louisiana's Welcome Home Act, passed in 2024. This act provides universal recognition of occupational licenses throughout Louisiana, giving anyone who moves to the state with a specific and skilled license the ability to build a career here. While many pieces of legislation have passed to give licensure reciprocity to specific occupations, this act clears a big hurdle to not cherrypick accepted licenses but provided a way to encompass all potential employees. This was a major step forward to enhancing the quality of life for our airmen and their families.


The Louisiana National Guard (LANG) stations the 178th Cyber Protection Team in Bossier City in the summer of 2025.

This supply/demand ratio shows that Shreveport-Bossier currently only has enough cybersecurity workers to fill 73 percent of the local employers' demand. The national average is 74 percent. Both of these numbers are down from the previous year where both the national and SBC percentages were fulfilling almost 10 percent more of the demand.



Louisiana Economic Development has launched Louisiana Innovation (LA.IO), a new division of LED dedicated to making Louisiana a leader in the development of more high-growth, technologyenabled startup companies.

LA.IO's first initiative will be development of the Louisiana Institute for Artificial Intelligence. This 501c3 will serve as the state's lead anchor for our statewide Al strategy, which is focused on applied research and development, commercialization, workforce

development and policy. The Institute's first project will be to upgrade 5,000 small businesses across Louisiana with AI tools that will enable them to scale their business and improve their competitiveness.




