


HEALTHCARE

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) budget, and the research at medical schools and teaching hospitals that it funds, is an investment that results in saved lives, better health, economic growth, stronger local and regional economies, and U.S. global leadership in science and technology. Medical schools and teaching hospitals conduct nearly 55% of all NIH extramural research.






GROSS REGIONAL PRODUCT FOR BOSSIER



Situated at the mouth of the Mississippi River, Louisiana has abundant crude oil and natural gas reserves both onshore and offshore, buried beneath the thick sediments of the Mississippi Delta.







EMERGING INDUSTRY

Louisiana could become the carbon capture capital of the South. Propelled by federal funding promoting carbon dioxide sequestration technology, a governor focused on reducing emissions and the geological formations to make it all possible, Louisiana is flourishing in this industry.

During the past year the combination of those factors has led to \$6.1 billion in announced carbon capture projects promising hundreds of new permanent jobs and thousands of construction jobs in Louisiana.

Bia Energy Operating Company announced that it is evaluating a \$550 million blue methanol production plant that would be located at the Port of Caddo-Bossier. The plant would feature carbon capture capabilities reducing CO2 emissions by more than 90% compared to other methanol plants. If the plant becomes operational, the company BiaEnergy would create 75 direct new jobs and 390 indirect jobs.

GEOGRAPHY OF THE HAYNESVILLE REGION


Industry reports show that natural gas production in the U.S. is surging, due in part to production from the Haynesville Shale, the third-largest natural gas producer in the nation. Industry publications are seeing a shift in investment leaving the northeast states in favor of the Haynesville Shale due to pipelines and infrastructure in Louisiana for LNG exports.

CARBON CAPTURE AND

STORAGE(CCS) involves the capture of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions from industrial processes, such as steel and cement production, or from the burning of fossil fuels in power generation. This carbon is then transported from where it was produced, via ship or in a pipeline, and stored deep underground in geological formations.

BLUE METHANOL

is produced using blue hydrogen in combination with carbon capture technology, vastly reducing well-to-tank carbon dioxide emissions.





DEFENSE

Barksdale Air Force Base is the largest single employer in NWLA, making defense one of our largest industries.

2022 NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT

Barksdale Air Force Base:



\$40 million for the construction of a weapons generation facility (WGF). This first installment to construct a WGF will ensure Barksdale's B-52s can be loaded with their nuclear payloads at Barksdale rather than at Minot Air Force Base in North Dakota.

\$36 million for the construction of a new gate and entrance complex that will accommodate traffic from the newly constructed I-20/I-220 interchange.



ACTIVE DUTY MILITARY

\$5 million appropriation from the U.S. Department of Defense (DoD) to support the Air Force Global Strike Command (AFGSC) to expand Global Strike Command's institutional capacity to develop future operational concepts and capabilities, establish operational requirements, evaluate technology opportunities, build prototype systems, and conduct proof of concept demonstrations.





BROADBAND

Broadband (broad bandwidth) is any connection that allows data to move quickly from the internet to your device.

In 2019, LA. Gov. John Bel Edwards established the Broadband for Everyone Commission, and subsequently, ConnectLA was formed to eliminate the digital gaps in Louisiana by 2029. GUMBO (Granting Unserved Municipalities Broadband *Opportunities*) grants were established to help private providers get started in unserved areas of the state. Local governments partner with these providers to apply for the grants. Two waves of the grant have gone out so far, totaling \$168 million and hitting projects in 60 parishes.

In 2022, it was announced by the National Telecommunications and Information Administration that Louisiana is the *first recipient* of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Acts funds for broadband. We received \$3 million in grant funds for the broadband expansion planning phase and up to **\$1 billion** for actual implementation.

THE THREE PILLARS OF BROADBAND

ACCESS

Data indicates there are several hundred thousand households throughout Louisiana that lack broadband speeds of 100 megabits per second download and 20 megabits per second upload.

AFFORDABILITY

A big hurdle to broadband access for some residents is being able to afford monthly charges for internet service.

DIGITAL LITERACY

The goal of digital literacy initiatives is to provide learning opportunities and resources for users to gain a working knowledge of the devices and applications at use in their lives.



EDUCATION

BOSSIER SCHOOLS

Bossier Schools is the fastest growing school district north of I-10. According to performance scores for the 2020-21 school year, they are one of 28% of districts statewide to record an increase. Also, 91.8% of all school-age children in Bossier Parish attend a Bossier Parish public school.
